

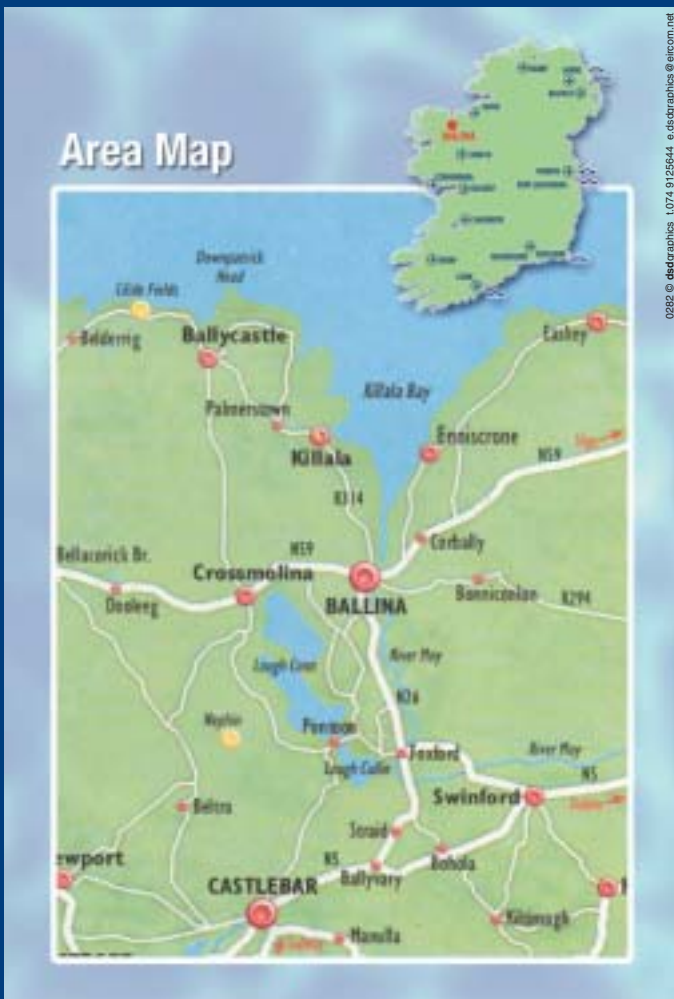

Salmon Court

An exclusive development of two semi-detached houses and two apartments located off Abbey Street, Ballina. Its setting, in a quiet courtyard with secure, off-street parking, within a few minutes walk of the town centre, makes it a very attractive holiday location.



Accommodation

Salmon Court has been designed and furnished to the highest standards, in accordance with specifications for four-star rating by the Irish



Tourist Board. The houses and one apartment each have two bedrooms, one double and one twin. The double bedrooms all have ensuite showers and there is a second electric shower in each bathroom. A ground floor apartment has one bedroom with a double bed and also accommodates a single bed. Each house has a patio area and a shed to the



rear for storage of fishing gear, bikes or other holiday equipment. The 2-bedroom apartment has a small balcony.

Ballina

Ballina is a thriving market town and tourism centre situated on the salmon rich River Moy in North Mayo. It is just four kilometres from County Sligo and is the ideal base for touring the Mayo/Sligo region. While it is best known as an angling centre, Ballina has a wide selection of facilities and is surrounded by a range of visitor attractions for the general

tourist. The town has a good selection of shops, an excellent range of restaurants and numerous pubs many of which provide entertainment, especially during the Summer months. Ballina is just ten minutes drive from the attractive seaside resort of Enniscrone and is surrounded by mountains, lakes and the coast.

Access

Ballina is 150 miles (241 km) from Dublin, 118 miles (190 km) from Shannon, 210 miles (338 km) from Rosslare and just 30 (48km) from Knock International Airport. It is served by train from Dublin and is linked by bus to numerous towns and cities. Galway city is 73 miles (117 km) away and Sligo town is 37 miles (59 km) from Ballina.

- » **Walking** - a stroll in Belleek Forest Park or a serious hike in the mountains

- » **Touring** - Ballina is the ideal base for touring the Mayo/Sligo region
